KING OF THE UNIVERSE

On the last Sunday of the liturgical year (23rd November this year) the Church celebrates the solemnity of Christ the King, or “Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe”, as it is now called. The feast was instituted by Pius IX in 1925 as a way of countering the increasing atheism and secularisation of society.

Some people might have problems with the language and imagery used in the texts for this celebration, believing that words like ‘king’ and ‘kingdom’ carry patriarchal and authoritarian connotations that are incompatible with Christianity and would prefer an image that speaks less of power and authority. The kingship of Christ is not about the power or splendour often associated with royalty. The Preface for the Feast describes Christ’s Kingdom as “a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace”.

With so much conflict across the world at present, the Prayer over the Offerings is very appropriate: “As we offer you, O Lord, the sacrifice by which the human race is reconciled to you, we humbly pray that your Son himself may bestow on all nations the gifts of unity and peace”.

In the Prayer after Communion we look forward to eternal life with Christ our King: “Having received the food of immortality, we ask, O Lord, that glorying in obedience to the commands of Christ, the King of the universe, we may live with him eternally in his heavenly Kingdom”.
