Second Reading Romans 8:18-23 A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

All creation is waiting for the revelation of the children of God.

I think that what we suffer in this life can never be compared to the glory, as yet unrevealed, which is waiting for us. The whole creation is eagerly waiting for God to reveal his sons. It was not for any fault on the part of creation that it was made unable to attain its purpose, it was made so by God; but creation still retains the hope of being freed, like us, from its slavery to decadence, to enjoy the same freedom and glory as the children of God. From the beginning till now the entire creation, as we know, has been groaning in one great act of giving birth; and not only creation, but all of us who possess the first-fruits of the Spirit, we too groan inwardly as we wait for our bodies to be set free.

Gospel

Matthew 13:1-23

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

A sower went out to sow.

Jesus left the house and sat by the lakeside, but such crowds gathered round him that he got into a boat and sat there. The people all stood on the beach, and he told them many things in parables.

He said, 'Imagine a sower going out to sow. As he sowed, some seeds fell on the edge of the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Others fell on patches of rock where they found little soil and sprang up straight away, because there was no depth of earth; but as soon as the sun came up they were scorched and, not having any roots, they withered away. Others fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Others fell on rich soil and produced their crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Listen, anyone who has ears!' Then the disciples went up to him and asked, 'Why do you talk to them in parables?' 'Because' he replied 'the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven are revealed to you, but they are not revealed to them. For anyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. The reason I talk to them in parables is that they look without seeing and listen without hearing or understanding. So in their case this prophecy of Isaiah is being fulfilled:

You will listen and listen again, but not understand, see and see again, but not perceive. For the heart of this nation has grown coarse, their ears are dull of hearing, and they have shut their eyes, for fear they should see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their heart, and be converted and be healed by me.

'But happy are your eyes because they see, your ears because they hear! I tell you solemnly, many prophets and holy men longed to see what you see, and never saw it; to hear what you hear, and never heard it.

'You, therefore, are to hear the parable of the sower. When anyone hears the word of the kingdom without understanding, the evil one comes and carries off what was sown in his heart: this is the man who received the seed on the edge of the path. The one who received it on patches of rock is the man who hears the word and welcomes it at once with joy. But he has no root in him, he does not last; let some trial come, or some persecution on account of the word, and he falls away at once. The one who received the seed in thorns is the man who hears the word, but the worries of this world and the lure of riches choke the word and so he produces nothing. And the one who received the seed in rich soil is the man who hears the word and produces now a hundredfold, now sixty, now thirty.'

Reflection on the Readings - Fr Louie



In the scriptures, we encounter numerous references to farming and agriculture. We read about sowing and reaping, tending to the fields, and relying on God's provision for a fruitful harvest. In these passages, we discover parallels between the natural process of

farming and the spiritual journey we embark upon in our lives.

One of the most profound illustrations of this can be found in the parable of the sower, which we just heard. Jesus compares the Word of God to a seed and describes different types of soil. The good soil represents hearts that are receptive, fertile, and ready to bear fruit.

But what makes soil good? Good soil is well-nourished, free from rocks and thorns, and possesses the necessary nutrients for growth. Similarly, in our spiritual lives, good soil represents hearts that are open, humble, and receptive to the teachings of Christ. It is a heart that has been prepared through prayer, repentance, and a sincere desire to know and follow God's will.

Good soil requires effort and intentionality. It requires us to remove the rocks of pride and self-centeredness that hinder our growth. It requires us to uproot the thorns of worldly distractions and desires that choke our spiritual vitality. And it calls us to constantly nourish our hearts through prayer, the study of Scripture, and partaking in the sacraments. At Mass, this nourishment is being offered to us. We are being fed by the Word of God and through the body and blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

When we cultivate the soil of our hearts, we create an environment where the seeds of God's Word can take root, grow, and bear fruit. It is through this process that we experience transformation, becoming more Christ-like in our thoughts, words, and actions.

However, let us remember that cultivating good soil is not a one-time task. Just as a farmer tends to the fields throughout the seasons, we too must continually grow to the condition of our hearts. We need to be vigilant, guarding against the weeds that hinders us to grow such as complacency, and spiritual dryness that can invade and suffocate our faith.

My dear friends, may we be diligent in our spiritual cultivation, constantly seeking to create an environment where God's Word can take root and

flourish. Let us remove the obstacles that hinder our growth, nurture our hearts with prayer and the sacraments, and allow God's grace to transform us into fruitful disciples.

Profession of Faith In union with the whole Church, let us profess our faith. I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, At the words that follow, up to and including 'the Virgin Mary', all bow. who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell: on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.



An Atmosphere of Prayer and Communion

The building we gather in for Eucharist is correctly called the house of the Church. It is the house where we, the faithful, gather. The building is important because of the people.

Preparing for Eucharist will differ for each person. Preparing the readings before coming is an excellent practice to adopt. Once in the house with our companion missionary disciples, time spent praying for those who will celebrate the Eucharist with you, for the ministers, the presider is time well spent.

How we pray also differs from person to person. Some join with friends to pray a decade of the rosary, the glorious mysteries. Others quietly reread the scriptures on the newsletter. Others prefer to be present to God in silence.

Many have not seen each other since last Sunday and so will warmly greet them and exchange some news.

We experience silence, group prayer and conversation. While silence is the most important activity, we can accommodate the other activities dear to people. With this in mind, I ask that conversations are moderate and held with a sensitivity to the brothers and sisters with you. Those praying the glorious mysteries, I ask that in St Patrick's you begin 45 minutes before the beginning of mass (8.15 in the morning and 4.45 in the afternoon).

Our overriding concern is that we do all we can to allow us as a community and as individuals to drink deeply all that Our Lord offers us while we are together.


